

You are invited to Saint Peter's Annual Halloween Parade Wednesday, October 31st, 2018 From 1:00 p.m. to 1:45 p.m.

Children do not come to school in costume. They carry their costumes to school in a bag, and will return home the same way. Costumes are to be simple, no make-up. All students are permitted to wear gym uniforms on that day. The children will put their costumes on over their gym uniform in the classroom. One prize will be awarded in each class for the best homemade costume. If a pair or group is chosen winner, the children will share the prize.

We ask that you park on Forman Avenue. PLEASE DO NOT PARK in the school parking lot. Also, do not park on Atlantic Avenue school side, which is where the buses park at dismissal. 
